**Week in Rap:** This week, the Week in Rap focused on the following topics:

- Impeachment

**Reading**: Today we took what we learned/reviewed last week in centers and worked in Google Classroom to practice what we learned. Students attempted to complete 3 Google Forms on:


- Story Mountain
- Conflict
- Author's Purpose

These practice forms allow me to see what the class was able to retain and apply and how to utilize their resources. They were allowed to work together and use their Reading Strategies section of their binder to help. Eventually students will see what they can do on their own, but for now we continue to practice, teach and work together.

#### Tuesday:

**Writer's Workshop:** Today in Writer's Workshop, students were given 3 different resources to help organize their writing:

- Narrative Diamond
- Hour-Glass
- Personal Narrative Graphic Organizer




I stressed that they find a tool that works best for THEM. I will continue to provide and teach many different tools/strategies, but they will find the one that works best for them!

After we modeled together, they applied it to their own writing they have been working on. They then had 15 minutes of writing stamina to continue adding to their stories. After time was up, they met in groups/partners and shared out all their hard work!

**Reading**: Today we reviewed the final reading skills we will be working with closely before reading *Because of Winn Dixie*:

- Tone/Mood
- Theme
- Point of View
- Inferencing/Predicting

Students got several **READING STRATEGY** guides to help them through. We used Flocabulary as a visual aid and went over centers for the rest of the week and what they would be doing.



#### Wednesday:

**Social Studies:** Today students got their Geography Study Guide and Vocabulary Study Guide. We watched a Flocabulary on Test-Taking Skills and Time Management. We also checked out Brain-Pop on study skills. Students understand they can't wait until the day before to study. We went over how to break down sections, practice small portions each

night, use games/flashcards, and **BRING THEIR ELA/SOCIAL STUDIES BINDER HOME!!!!** If you haven't seen it come home, **ASK FOR IT!**

## Thursday:


**Writer's Workshop:** Today we went back to our writing from Tuesday. We worked on an activity where students **SHOW IT**, not just **TELL IT**. They looked at regular "boring" sentences and practiced bringing them to life. They did an awesome job really making the reader feel like they were there.


Students are really doing a nice job making their writing **BETTER**. They are beginning to understand that writing is a process and this is the **FIRST DRAFT!** We can get better each time. At the end of class students added to their chart of **"WHAT GOOD WRITERS DO"** 



**Center Work**: Today students finished up their final 4 rounds of centers. Some questions to ask them:

- What is THEME? What are some common themes? What is the theme of the story they are currently reading?
- What is the difference between TONE and MOOD?
- What does it mean to INFER? How does the setting/characters and our background knowledge help to make these inferences?

- What is POINT OF VIEW? How do I know if it is 1st, 2nd, or 3rd person? What does it mean if 3rd person is LIMITED or OMNISCIENT?
- STUDENTS HAVE SEVERAL HELPFUL ANCHOR CHARTS IN THEIR READING STRATEGIES SECTION. ALL CLASSWORK IS ALSO IN THEIR ELA CLASSWORK SECTION. TAKE A LOOK WITH THEM!



**Friday:** ½ days are wild! Since our class has Special from 8:05-8:45 we have even more limited time. We split our classes from 8:45-9:45 then swapped homerooms from 9:45-10:45 so each class so both of us on short time.

Students took their spelling quiz (no basketball today because of limited time) and finished up any center work. They also had time for independent reading and writing if they finished up!

#### Thoughts/Feelings for the Week:

- I have to say I am very happy with both classes. We were able to start A Days and B Days a whole month earlier than we normally do because we felt these classes could handle that, so congrats to them! We feel this is really helpful to the kids to not always have MATH in the morning or READING. It's also a nice break up for the teachers to see the kids at different times of the day!
- We have also begun a lot of center work where students work in small groups with each other and also with the teacher. They are learning to transition, be prepared, stay focused and help each other in our learning. The groups have leaders and change constantly. I am a big believer in mixing up groups and having everyone work together at various points throughout the year. As we move forward I will look for some volunteers to help during center time, so if you are interested please reach out!
- Studying **MAKE SURE** we are spending time reviewing each night for upcoming tests/quizzes. We **ALWAYS** give at least a weeks notice and provide study guides/tools, etc. It is the students responsibility to bring home binders. If you're having trouble with studying tips, please let us know!
- Behaviors for the most part we are doing OK in this category. 4th grade is a tricky age. They are growing up fast, becoming more responsible, more activities, etc. They ALSO ARE WORKING WITH NEW FRIENDS/CLASSMATES/STUDENTS. With that being said, please continue to encourage ALL STUDENTS BEING RESPECTFUL. Everyone is different. We have different backgrounds, learning styles, home lives, abilities, etc. While I don't expect everyone to be best friends, I do expect RESPECT and the ability to work together to DO THEIR JOBS!
- Unstructured time like recess/lunch and locker times encourage your child to MAKE GOOD CHOICES. If a problem arises, please remember we have 43 students to look after and we are not perfect as well. We are doing our very best to manage, handle and deal with a number of varying situations. Don't always assume we know all and have all the answers. It takes a team AT SCHOOL AND AT HOME. So thank you for understanding and continued support. Both myself and Mrs. Mauricio are always here for the kids and we make ourselves more than readily available for any questions, concerns or needs.
